


# Assessing Plan B: The Effects of the Morning After Pill on Children and Women

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#### **Summary**

- ✓ The authors look at the effect of quasi-experimental variation in the availability of the emergency contraceptive ("morning after") pill in Chile.
- ✓ Data: censal data on all births and fetal deaths over the period 2005-2011.
- ✓ Results: the availability of the pill reduces pregnancy and early gestation fetal death (proxy for illegal abortion).
- ✓ Stronger effects for teenagers and young women
- ✓ First paper of its kind








# Teenage Pregnancy in Chile: 56 births every 1,000 teenagers
